

## SHOW PROCEDURES FOR 2012 ALPACA ONTARIO FULL FLEECE HALTER SHOW (AS PER ALPACA CANADA SHOW SYSTEM – 2012 REVISION)

### OVERVIEW

The Alpaca Ontario Show 2012 includes full fleece halter classes for both Huacaya and Suri fibre types. The SSC has applied to Alpaca Canada to sanction the 2012 show and, therefore, must apply the new ACSS rules.

The following information outlines most general show procedures.

**Please note that significant changes from previous non-sanctioned shows are indicated by an \*.**

### AGE DIVISIONS – ages as of April 13, 2012

1. Juveniles           6 months to under 12 months
2. Yearlings           12 months to under 24 months
3. Two year olds   24 months to under 36 months
4. Mature             36 months and over

### COLOUR CLASSES

1. White
2. Light (includes beige, light fawn)
3. Fawn (includes medium and dark fawn)
4. Brown (includes light, medium and dark brown)
5. Black (bay black and black)
6. Grey (silver and rose grey)
7. Multi **\*NEW IN 2012 – BEST MULTI PINNACLE AWARD\***

*\*(Please note the ACSS colour definition for Multi will now apply – ‘An alpaca is to be shown in the multi class if it exhibits two or more colours that are distinct and immediately visible and are situated on the alpaca below the head and above the knees. Example: As per the colour divisions in Section 2d, a medium fawn alpaca with a dark fawn spot would not be a multi. A white alpaca with a brown spot meeting the size requirement would be a multi. If an alpaca has a single spot at skin level less than 3 cm in diameter below the head and above the knees, the alpaca will go into its predominant colour class.’)\**

### CLASS PROCEDURE

Based on the entries of the past few years, Huacayas will compete in a Level 1 show and the Suris in a Level 2 show (*please refer to page 9 of the ACSS for full explanation*). All numbers apply to the number of alpacas that enter the ring on the day of the show.

### COLOUR CHAMPIONS HUACAYA

Minimum number to award a colour championship shall be 10 huacaya alpacas per colour and per sex. Six colour classification groups will compete for colour and reserve champions: White, Light, Fawn, Brown, Black and Grey

**\*First place huacaya alpacas competing in the Multi colour classification will complete for the pinnacle award of BEST MULTI and do not complete for Supreme Champion.\***

### SUPREME CHAMPIONS HUACAYA

Minimum number to award supreme is 30 huacaya alpacas in one sex.

All colour champions will come back to compete for Supreme Male Huacaya and Supreme Female Huacaya. **\*Alpacas within the multi colour designation are not considered for Supreme Champion.\***

### BEST IN SHOW HUACAYA

Supreme Male Huacaya and Supreme Female Huacaya will compete for BEST IN SHOW HUACAYA trophy.

### COLOUR CHAMPIONS SURI

Minimum number to award a colour championship shall be 6 suri alpacas per colour. Sexes may be combined to attain colour champions where necessary.

Six colour classification groups will compete for colour and reserve champions: White, Light, Fawn, Brown, Black and Grey.

**\*First place suri alpacas competing in the Multi colour classification will complete for the pinnacle award of BEST MULTI SURI and do not complete for BEST IN SHOW.\***

### BEST IN SHOW SURI

All champions move forward to compete for best in show suri. **\*Alpacas within the multi colour classification are not considered for BEST IN SHOW.\***

### GROUP HALTER CLASSES

**\*The SSC has voted not to allow entry of group classes in the name of CLAA recorded animals (0%)\***
